I have been involved with the Foyer movement in Australia for nearly 8 years. People often identify youth foyers as

a homelessness solution for young people. But I see what we do as more about improving young people's access to education and training.

Foyers are a safe place where young people can be surrounded by people who believe in them, a place where they have access to support as and when they need it, a place where their journey to independence is respected, a place where they learn the role that their friends and their communities will play in supporting them through the many opportunities that life can offer them.

As real as those sentiments are, the Foyer Foundation remains an organisation committed to the rigor and discipline of identifying what works; and continuously moving towards what works better.

The last twelve months has been another very positive period of growth and improvement, as we continue to build our capacity to lead a vibrant foyer movement in every state and territory of Australia. We now see a pipeline of youth foyers, accredited by the Foyer Foundation, emerging across our nation. Our target of 30 Accredited Youth Foyers by 2030 feels very achievable.

In this report the Board acknowledges the significant contribution of Sinead Gibney Hughes as our first Executive Officer and is delighted with the appointment of Katie Hooper, our new CEO, who joined us in February 2020. We are particularly pleased with the increase in the breadth of private sector funding we have received in the last 12 months – and Katie has been instrumental in leading that work.

I would also like to acknowledge the contributions made by my fellow board members and we will continue to set high standards for ourselves and our organisation.

There is much more to be done. The pathways for our nation's most challenged young people has become a lot harder than it was 12 months ago. But the momentum is with us and I look forward to reporting more progress in another 12 months.


I look forward to keeping you updated as we continue our foyer expansion and support of young people into the 2021 year.

With no stable housing




Motivated for education and employment

Our Financials

The last financial year to June 2020 was one of considerable change for the Foyer Foundation. We finished with a loss of \$45,998, net equity of \$152,002 and staff costs representing some 68% of total expenses.

We invested in the development of the Foyer Foundation website, recruitment, financial reporting and the COVID-19 related awareness activities and programs for Foyers.

Strategic initiatives will continue to rollout this year as we refine the Foyer related evidence base through data of the effectiveness of improving access to education for young people within the confines of a safe place to live.

A key focus remained on broadening the depth of our private sector funding for the Foundation working with philanthropic partners and establishing the Foyer 5000 group of donors. We thank each and every donor for working with us to improve the lives of young people within the Foyer family.
